



RELIABLE CARE YOU CAN COUNT ON

When Linda Wittenback's annual mammogram detected a suspicious spot, she was referred to the Cancer Center at Baptist Health Corbin. An ultrasound confirmed the abnormality, and her providers recommended a biopsy — but the scheduling system showed no available appointments that day.

That's when nurse navigator Joyce Brown stepped in to get the ball rolling. "Joyce has had breast cancer twice and thyroid cancer," Linda said. "She said, 'I want you and [your husband,] Robert, to get some lunch. Come back and we'll do the biopsy this afternoon."



The Cancer Center at Baptist Health Corbin offers advanced diagnostic and treatment procedures as well as a wide range of resources to support patients like Linda on their road to recovery – from diagnosis to survivorship.

Our interdisciplinary cancer care team works together to determine the best course of action for each patient, offering the following treatment options:

- Surgery, including minimally invasive and highly precise robot-assisted procedures.
- Medical oncology, including chemotherapy, immunotherapy and hormonal therapy.
- Radiation oncology, including specialized treatments such as intensity-modulated radiation therapy and image-guided radiation.

Our experienced team is committed not only to fighting cancer, but to supporting the well-being of patients and their loved ones along the way. Baptist Health Corbin offers the best possible treatment in a location that's close to home and with providers who treat patients like family.

HIGH-QUALITY HEALTHCARE AT HOME

Professional photographer Bill Fortney describes himself as a child at heart who's always up for an adventure — like flying an ultralight aircraft cross-country to take stunning aerial photos. Though he's officially retired, slowing down wasn't part of the plan.

Then came the chest pains he couldn't ignore.

"One morning I was here at the house, and I started really having a lot of pressure in my chest," said the longtime Corbin resident. Hoping to be reassured, he called his daughter, Catherine, a practice manager with the Baptist Health Corbin Heart Care team. "I really didn't want to go to the hospital, but she said, 'Dad, get your you-know-what in here.' It saved my life."

Baptist Health Corbin provides superior heart care and access to the Appalachian region's most comprehensive, multidisciplinary team of cardiac specialists and innovative therapies.

"I think we are very fortunate in Appalachia – where we don't have a lot of things that other places have – to have real high-quality healthcare here," Bill said.

Baptist Health Corbin is a vital part of the community, with outreach and education programs to prevent and address heart conditions, along with advanced treatment options. Cardiovascular care includes:

- Fast heart attack response.
- · Noninvasive services like EKG, Holter monitors, echocardiogram and stress tests.
- · Radiology screenings, including nuclear studies and MRI.
- Electrophysiology studies to diagnose heart conditions without surgery.
- Extensive open-heart surgery program.
- Cardiac rehabilitation programs to help patients recover and maintain good health.
- · Pacemaker and other device implantation for congestive heart failure patients.
- · Cardiac catheterization to detect blockages and assess heart function.

EXCELLENT, COMPASSIONATE CARE

When you hear that a person is experiencing chest pain and numbness, what do you think could be the cause? If you're like Lisa Gatliff, you think: heart attack. That's what she thought when she experienced those very symptoms late one night. Lisa was in such distress that she feared for her life. She knew she had to get to the hospital.

Her body went into panic as her daughter escorted her into the emergency department. Lisa's mind raced with horrible thoughts. She was terrified that the worst was happening. At that moment, Lisa saw a familiar face. The nurse coming to help her was her daughter's friend, Rebecca Collins. She felt an overwhelming sense of relief in an instant. Of course, she knew the challenges were still ahead, but seeing a familiar face in such a scary situation gave her comfort and hope.

After running an EKG, the nursing staff discovered that the cause of her symptoms was not a heart attack but was instead the result of hypertension. Fortunately, they were able to quickly remedy the issue by placing her on a medication that would work to stabilize her blood pressure.

From the reassuring smile on Rebecca's face to the expert diagnosis of her condition and the prescribed solution, the treatment that she received is something that Lisa will always remember. Lisa went into the hospital not knowing if she would come back out. Instead, she left with the knowledge that she received excellent, compassionate care.



BEHAVIORAL **HEALTH**

HEALING FROM THE INSIDE OUT

With a vision rooted in the belief that behavioral health is equally as important as physical health, Baptist Health Corbin delivers compassionate, personalized care to help our patients to thrive, not just survive.

Mental illness is just that, a form of illness. The phrase typically refers to a wide range of conditions that are most evident in a person's feelings, thought patterns and behaviors, rather than in physical injury or ailment. Symptoms must be prolonged or severe enough to create issues in daily living, with personal relationships, or result in harm to one's self or others. Mental illness is treatable through several therapeutic methods, sometimes in combination, that take into account the physical, psychological, social, cultural and hereditary roots of the disorder.

At Baptist Health Corbin, the focus is on the whole person – body, mind and spirit. Our behavioral health services provide care for individuals dealing with mental illness, such as anxiety, depression, and drug and alcohol dependency. With treatment plans tailored to meet each person's needs, we help our patients understand and manage their conditions.

NURSING EXCELLENCE FUND

ENABLING EXCELLENCE THROUGH EDUCATION AND SUPPORT

Nurses are at the center of our healthcare experience. Time and time again, nurses serve as an example of compassion, collaboration and joy, caring and advocating for patients and their loved ones. The Nursing Excellence Fund supports our nurses through funding for education, research and equipment, so they can provide high-quality healthcare for us all.

YOUR DOLLARS AT WORK

PROVIDING EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE THROUGH DISASTER

As the flood waters rose in eastern Kentucky last year, Brenda Baker, MD, watched a practice she has spent her entire career building wash away.

"All I could think about was how to keep serving my patients," said Dr. Baker. "We're the only medical practice in town and everything was completely under water."

Dr. Baker is an independent family medicine specialist in the small town of Neon, Kentucky, where she has dedicated nearly 30 years to serving patients. When the flooding began in late July, water completely filled her office, ruining equipment, supplies and medications at a time when the community would be needing her most. While filled with determination to keep her patients healthy, she did not know where to turn.

"It was daunting to think about how to recover. But then you have people like Baptist Health who stepped in to help," recalled Dr. Baker. "They really were lifesavers."

On Aug. 4, Baptist Health's Wellness on Wheels mobile health clinic was loaded with supplies such as boxes of gloves, wipes, gauze, and other clinical items and sent to mobilize a temporary clinic at a local middle school. Volunteers from Baptist Health Corbin organized staffing to provide care.

Thanks to the generous philanthropic support provided by 200 donors throughout the U.S., more than 70 patients received care such as tetanus and hepatitis A vaccinations, COVID-19 tests, intravenous fluids and more.

Approximately \$42,000 was donated to the Baptist Health Foundation Emergency Assistance Fund, which Baptist Health matched, enabling the mobile medical unit to remain in the affected communities during the peak of the crisis.

"Even as the unit departed, Baptist Health left us with supplies, a generator, and a portable Wi-Fi unit to ensure care continues to be provided as we start the process of moving forward," said Dr. Baker.

As natural disasters once again affected the state, Baptist Health was quick to respond and offer help.

"We are in the business of healing. Each of us are in healthcare because we have been called to serve. When crisis strikes, we are compelled to fulfill our mission of demonstrating the love of Christ to improve the health in our communities," said Baptist Health CEO Gerard Colman. "We are humbled by the outpouring of support which has been shown to our eastern Kentucky friends and neighbors."



GRATEFUL PATIENT

GRATEFUL FOR THE BRIGHTEST MINDS AND THE BIGGEST HEARTS

Can you recall the most impactful birthday you've ever had? Can you pinpoint one phone call that changed the course of your entire life? Karlyle Young didn't have to think twice when contemplating the same questions.

Karlyle wasn't surprised when she received a call to come in for follow-up procedures after a routine mammogram performed on her birthday. She knew that she had fibrous breast tissue and assumed they would need a closer look.

"When the doctor came back in after the biopsy, I knew," she said. "You could see the pain on her face as she delivered the news. It was obvious that she cared. Everybody there explained it. There were no dumb questions. They knew they were the medical professionals and I was the patient. They walked me through it."

With a long road ahead of her after being diagnosed with breast cancer that was already advanced, Karlyle began to Google cancer. She stumbled upon some funny t-shirts that helped to add a positive spin to a negative situation and decided that this would be her focus as she underwent her treatment plan. Themed t-shirts became Karlyle's trademark as she underwent numerous chemotherapy and radiation therapy treatments.

"It's been a crazy year, but I would probably be near death had I not had that original mammogram. I've lost my hair twice; my kids have seen me too sick to hold up my head. My husband has had to become Mr. Mom. But without that mammogram, we'd be planning my funeral."

Karlyle underwent a double mastectomy and a total hysterectomy in an effort to best mitigate the likelihood of recurring cancer down the road. While performing the procedures to achieve the coveted remission status, her medical team learned that she had high-grade serous carcinoma of the ovary. This preventive treatment may have saved her life with the early detection of ovarian cancer.

"My chemo posse was with me through the darkest days. They uplifted me, made me laugh – they are angels. Other than marrying my husband and having my kids, this is the best decision I've ever made."

As she prepared for additional rounds of chemotherapy and radiation, she was determined to make the transition from having cancer to cancer survivor. Karlyle continues her fight and is still working through her current treatment plan.

"I don't know God's plan for me. I don't know how long I have on this planet. But I know with the excellent medical professionals at Baptist Health, I have a fighting chance to irritate my kids into old age. Whether I'm cancer-free or must fight some more — my doctors, nurses, medical staff down to the janitors — Baptist saved my life. This team has the brightest minds and the biggest hearts."
